CASE STUDY

OBJECTIVE

The air cargo airlines servicing George Bush Houston Intercontinental Airport were operationally and economically constrained by functionally obsolete facilities that restricted growth and fostered inefficient operations. The Central Cargo Area was comprised of facilities that were approximately three decades old, had not been well maintained, offered “through the fence” tug access to a shared aircraft apron area, and failed to offer essential operational and structural amenities.

STRATEGY

Trammell Crow Company proposed to develop an approximately 100-plus acre Greenfield site east of the Central Terminal Area. The Airport provided essential extensions of airport infrastructure including: extensions of taxi lanes, tug roads, and jet fuel lines and twelve aircraft hardstands.

VALUE CREATION

TCC delivered a state-of-the-art International Air CargoCentre™ offering its airline tenants approximately 160,000 square feet of cargo office and warehouse space and direct airfield access to 12 aircraft hardstand positions. The facility’s design maximizes operational and economic efficiencies for its tenants. Due to the favorable economics of the new International Air CargoCentre™, several existing air cargo airlines relocated to the East Cargo Area. Trammell Crow Company facilitated the relocation needs of the United States Postal Service which in turn allowed the airport to demolish several of the exiting air cargo facilities within the Central Cargo Area. The elimination of several facilities allowed the airport to reclaim precious land, expand the Central Terminal Area and add additional taxi lanes around the terminal area. This will enables the airport to rehabilitate several of the existing facilities that have become functionally obsolete within the Central Cargo Area.
